Good evening and a warm welcome to you all, wherever you may be watching or listening from. A welcome also to our visitors, King's Lynn Town, their manager Ian Culverhouse, his players and staff. This is our first league match here at the EBB for nearly three weeks and it is good to be back home again, although we continue to miss our supporters very much.

The last match we played here was on 2 April, Good Friday, against a very good Stockport side. It was always going to be a really tough day, they are one of the biggest spenders in the division, fully backing the Club to get promoted. It ended up being a really strange game as for spells we were up against it and then we ended up having the chances that we did at the end of the game which meant we probably should have got something out of it. Over the 90 minutes Stockport probably deserved the win to be fair and as I said, the chances we created at the end and the one we missed from the set-piece, you would have expected us to have got a point out of the game.

But I was pleased with a lot of things we did do in that game and we competed which is important and we took that into the Dagenham game on Easter Monday where I thought not only were we very, very good but we were very comfortable. With the 3:0 win last Tuesday down at Weymouth we had then kept three clean sheets in our last three away games which was pleasing.

The boys are working hard to make sure that we become harder to score against but without losing that cutting-edge going forwards. That is very difficult

to do at times, trying to reassert yourself from a defensive perspective - you have to make sacrifices if you want to stop the opposition penetrating your side. To be fair, the work we've been doing, we've managed so far to try and find that happy medium. We know there are still nine games left but we are still creating chances at one end and we are denying the opposition chances at the other. It was disappointing then to lose on Saturday at Barnet after all of the hard work the staff and players have been putting in and it would have been frustrating for the supporters watching the match too, especially after seeing how well we can play.

We need our supporters support more than ever so if we can help with the engagement (by producing good football) we will but we need them in! We need them to help put some much-needed finances in to the Club in addition to what they are already doing because like so many, we are not finding it easy at the minute and we are working under quite big restraints. One thing our board are doing is trying to make sure that regardless what happens that the Club is stable and able to operate on a day-to-day basis. I think everybody involved has done a good job with that so far but there are consequences to that, and that is why the support is needed wherever.

Today's visitors, despite being well down the table, have had some good performances this season and I don't want anyone to think that because we are playing a team who are in the relegation places that it is going to be easy - it doesn't work like that as we found out on Saturday at Barnet. They had kept a clean sheet at Maidenhead and then built on that in their win over us. There are no 'givens' in this league and we have to be as switched on for King's Lynn as we are against Notts County and Stockport, that's what makes our league so good.

After nearly three weeks away from the EBB Stadium and the Good Friday defeat by Stockport County and two wins and a loss on the road following that game, Jamie reflects on the matches.

It was a tight defeat at home to Stockport and disappointing after there were chances to gain a point towards the end of the match. How did Jamie feel the game went?

I think we put on a good performance, we weren't too unhappy with how we played. I think that probably one or two individual errors cost us but having said that, I think we had a really good chance at the end to get an equalizer and I think we did limit them to a couple of chances - which they took. But Stockport are a top team and I think it says a lot about how we have been in the last couple of games where we've been disappointed that we didn't pick something up from the match. I think on Good Friday we at least deserved a draw from our performance.

Following on from that though was the excellent 2:0 win on Easter Monday, away to Dagenham and Redbridge, something Jamie is very pleased with.

It was again another really good performance from us, we stuck to what the game plan was and to implement it and I think we did that very well as a team. Dagenham, with the players they have got they shouldn't be where they are in the table and having now played against them you can see that for some reason it's not working there at the moment, but we kept to worrying about ourselves and our performance. We kept a clean sheet as well which made two in the previous three games and we took our chances. To be honest we probably could have had a few more so it was a very positive day.



The strong away performance and clean sheet was then followed up with another in the match down at Weymouth last Tuesday evening, the Shots winning 3:0. Jamie was delighted with what was now a third consecutive win on the road and another clean sheet too

We are definitely having an emphasis at the moment on keeping a clean sheet, because if you do that it then gives you a real chance to win the game. Weymouth were not that strong but I felt we were excellent both attacking and defensively and it was great to see the three goals going in.

Unfortunately the run of good form came to an end on Saturday lunchtime, away to Barnet. This was disappointing for everyone when the Bees have been very much the whipping boys of the division of late.

We just weren't good enough on Saturday, all over the park. They certainly seemed to want it more and we didn't seem able to match that in any way. We certainly don't want to assume that any match is easy and with that in mind and with King's Lynn also down in what would normally be the relegation places, we will be really focussed this evening on getting back to a strong performance and looking for the win and the three points.



SHOTS NEWS & VIEWS

I write these notes aware of the fact that somewhere, far, far above my head and the collective heads of the two teams competing in tonight's match, Aldershot Town and King's Lynn, a huge battle is going on for the continuation of the football pyramid as we know it. Yesterday's stunning news that no fewer than six clubs, currently members of the Premier League are to take part, from next season, in something called the European Super League, appears to have caught everyone on the hop (apart from those six clubs and the 'powers that be' behind the ESL) and has sent all of the sport news stations and the back – and front page probably – of every daily newspaper into a flat spin.

Arsenal, Chelsea, Liverpool, Manchester United, Manchester City and Tottenham Hotspur propose, as I see it at the moment (it's a fast-moving picture, who knows where this story will be by tomorrow – Tuesday- evening?) to compete in a midweek league with six other clubs from Europe and in an arrangement which sees them locked into that league – there is no relegation, no way of admitting other clubs except by special invitation. It looks to me like a classic case of scrambling up the ladder and then kicking away the tree ascender in order that nobody else follow. In fact, it is completely and entirely contrary to the way that football has operated for over 100 years and across three different centuries in this country, a system where whatever your humble beginnings as a club, you always had that tiny spark inside you that your team could climb the leagues and

divisions and arrive at the very top of the tree. Unlikely? Just ask supporters of Watford or Bournemouth, both clubs whom Aldershot FC and Town have played at the bottom end of the Football League, Wycombe Wanderers or Crawley or Stevenage fans or even followers of tonight's visitors, a club only formed in 2010 after the demise of King's Lynn FC, just how much progress a well-run and organised team can make in the English football pyramid. And of course ourselves, who rose five divisions in 16 years in our journey back to the Football League. The dream is there for a reason and this kind of breakaway league has to power to destroy it all – if we let it.

Watching Match of the Day 2 last evening I was greatly impressed by the passion and controlled anger that Danny Murphy and Dion Dublin showed when discussing this development. Host Mark Chapman let them speak freely and it was clear that the two men have no time for this 'ESL'. There does appear to be some concern that players who compete in it will not be permitted to play for their countries and with several of the six clubs' managers having previously implied they already play too many matches, what hope is there for them continuing to compete in either the FA or League Cup? No more dreams of a huge money-spinning tie for a lower or non-league club and the wonderful memories that leaves, win, lose or draw – no, these clubs will be too busy competing in their 'midweek competition'. I for one though cannot believe that players will want to sacrifice competing in the FA Cup (they may not worry so much about the League Cup!) and I definitely cannot believe that they are



willing to give up the opportunity of playing for their country. We need those players to speak out now because if they don't, then I fear that the juggernaut will keep gaining momentum and will be impossible to stop. Without players this new league will be nothing and I would like to see them speak out now fearlessly – no match or fancy new league can go ahead without the 'assets' – and I am sure there are plenty of men in those six clubs who are capable of speaking out boldly and leading their team mates along with them. If they don't, then the juggernaut will only gather speed faster and faster, crushing all that is good in football.

My heart breaks for people I know who are huge Aldershot Town supporters but also support one of these six teams. The sadness and anger in their social media postings has been very apparent over the past 36 hours (I'm writing this Monday lunchtime). There are people saying they won't watch any of these teams play again all the while they are committed to competing in the ESL and I admire them for that. I'm not sure that I could stop watching the Shots but then, right down at our level this kind of nonsense will never impact on us. Or will it? As I said above, football in this country has for years relied on the pyramid and its promotion and relegation system and many people are certainly discussing this matter with the view that the ESL impact could ripple right through the leagues, even down to non-league level. Although it may not feel like it sometimes, Premier League funding does trickle down to the National League – it may not be much, but it won't be anywhere near what it has been if this so-called 'big six' are not playing in

the Premier League, although the ESL are saying at the moment that teams will 'continue to compete in their respective national leagues'. We shall see.

Others who have NL football right at the heart of all they see good in the game are already messaging across social media inviting disaffected supporters of those six clubs to come and watch football at its purest level, the non-league system. We will have to hope that whatever storm is raging above our lower- and non-league heads that we will not be too badly impacted, especially after the awful year that all football has gone through, with club finances taking an almighty battering, and that there will still be football at this level to watch. I personally believe that there will be and hopefully we can continue to enjoy football, despite what those whose thoughts appear to be up in the clouds think that football is all about.

Football is a patch of green grass, 22 players, three officials and a group of passionate and supportive people watching it around the edge with all of their hopes and dreams on display – the most important part of the whole proceedings some might say. That may be an overly simple point of view but it has worked that way for over 150 years – let's all do what we can now to try and keep it that way for another 150 – it's our game, the people's and we must keep it that way.

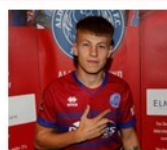

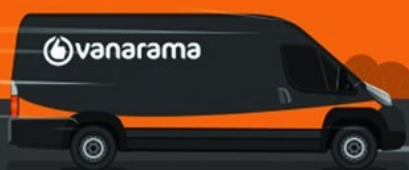

THE BIG INTERVIEW

Last season was the first for many seasons when Aldershot Town had just one player between the goalkeeping posts for every single game – Mitch Walker was an ever-present throughout the 2019-20 campaign which was abruptly ended, due to world-wide events, in March of 2020. This season though has seen no fewer than three different goalmouth custodians – Walker, Middlesbrough loanee Brad James and then, for a run of three matches in March, Academy graduate Ryan Hall, after Mitch tested positive for Covid-19 and was unable to play.

Hall, who has been a part of the first team squad for nearly two seasons now, arrived at the Aldershot Town Academy in 2017.

'I got released from Portsmouth and I was doing a few trials which was around the summer of 2017. That was when I came in to do a trial with the Aldershot Town Academy.'

At the time the Academy was under the leadership of Lee Collins but not long after Ryan signed for Aldershot Town, Lee moved on and was replaced by current manager Ross McNeilly, assisted by Ross White. Ryan cites both men as being a huge support to him, along with a key member of the first team squad.

'Both of the Rosses have been really supportive, they've been really helpful with my progression while I was with the Academy and really helpful when I was starting to make that step up. Since I have been working with the first team everyone's been helpful, all the staff have supported me and guided me but I think Mitch Walker has been really helpful. He takes all the (goalkeeper) sessions in training, he's always trying to get me better, giving me advice and everything.'

Clearly Ryan feels well-supported here at the EBB Stadium. What, for him, makes being at Aldershot Town special? It appears that he has a family connection to the area which helps!

'There are two things that I enjoy about being here. When I first came here the Academy was very welcoming and it was a good academy, a good standard of football. Also, there's the fact that my mum is from Aldershot so when we found out I was trialling here we were quite pleased. I just think that everyone here is quite welcoming, it's a good club and supportive.'

Wearing number 13 for the Shots and now clearly the number two keeper at the Club, has Ryan always been between the sticks in his playing career?

'I've always played in goal, maybe apart from school games. I probably thought I was good enough to play outfield there, but otherwise I've always played in goal.'

And all of those countless matches playing in goal came to fruition for Ryan when he made his first team debut for Aldershot Town in the FA Trophy in December 2018. With the Shots, having drawn with Bedford Town at home in the FA Trophy, reeling under a huge injury list and facing a busy Christmas spell of matches, then-manager Gary Waddock made the decision to play the youth team in the replay. It was an unexpected opportunity for all of those youngsters, to go out and play a professional match for their club. What did it mean to Ryan, who was aged just 18 at the time?

'It meant a lot. When I found out that we (the youth team) were going to be playing I was very happy and I couldn't wait until the game started. And once I got there and I also found out I was going to be captain, that was amazing as well. Even though it wasn't a league debut it was the highlight of my career so far.'

Wearing the captain's armband clearly meant a lot to Ryan in that game, as well as playing in it. Does he feel he has leadership qualities?

'I have found that it depends on the different environments. So in the academy I feel like I do. I feel like I'm going to be one of the main ones to be chosen for that kind of thing – I am captain quite often. But since I have come up to the first team it's a whole different sort of environment. I would say that I am quite a quiet person around the camp but as soon as I am on the pitch I am louder, so on the pitch I can definitely be one of the leaders.'

That ability to be loud on the pitch was apparent to anyone watching the streams of the three recent league matches that Ryan played in. Within moments of his league debut he was clearly heard to be shouting "keeper's ball" as he looked to involve himself in the game and impress on the opposition his ownership of the penalty area. Making your debut is important to all footballers at any level and although there had been the Trophy match in 2018, the Altrincham match, and win, now hold a huge significance in Ryan's life.

'The league debut is something special. I feel quite lucky as well. I found out a few days before that I was playing so I was able to prepare myself properly, mentally and physically and it was totally different from the FA Trophy game. I maybe needed a few minutes just to adjust at first but once the game started, I was full of confidence, happy and I felt good while I was out there.'

The match ended in a 2:1 win and Ryan played a huge part in that win when, in the dying minutes of the match he made a magnificent save from an Altrincham free-kick. It was a big save and he explains how it looked from between the goalposts.

'It was a difficult free kick, actually. It probably favoured the player seeing how close he was and his line of direction to the goal. So I was quite lucky the

ball was close to me but it felt good saving that and I felt like a part of that game and part of that win.'

Still only 20, Ryan has plenty of years in front of him to develop as a player but what does he think he sees as the best parts of his goalkeeping at the moment?

'In the past couple of years it's not always been my strong spot but now I feel like my distributing and my kicking and throwing has come on well, I have improved it a lot. So I feel that is probably one of my main attributes. Also, shot-stopping as well, but mainly at the moment it's my distribution and my kicking.'

And what is he looking to work on and improve? For Ryan it is that all-important change up from youth to professional football that is key.

'There's always a lot to work on but I think the main one at the moment is probably adjusting to that first team men's football. It's when the ball is coming in when I'm taking a cross or from a corner, it's about being demanding. I've got my confidence to come for it, but it's about going through people and coming and claiming it in the box.'





So is it important, being able to play in first team games in order to develop as a player? Ryan thinks this is definitely the case.

'You can only get so much better at training, you've got to play the games and every game you play you learn something different and you are going to get better in a different way. One game you might manage something, then not in the next. In my second game I struggled (a 1:0 loss at FC Halifax Town) and I've learned from that – every game you've got to learn some things and not dwell on your mistakes.'

The role of goalkeeper is unique in football – the other ten men in your team might be able to defend, score goals, cross balls and tackle and they all wear the same colour shirt – but only the keeper can handle the ball. And they get to wear a different coloured strip as well! Does Ryan feel he has more in common with his fellow keepers that he has trained with this season, Mitch and Bradley James, than perhaps other team mates?

'You have a few exceptions with some people, but generally you've got more in common with another goalkeeper. You play in the same position and a lot of people feel like, it's such a different position in football it's like you're not even a footballer at all, you can catch the ball and you can't do that in outfield positions! The goalkeepers have something, we call it the goalkeeper union, and we are a lot closer I would say.'

Ryan played three matches during March – the win and loss mentioned above and he was also involved in the 3:3 thriller with Boreham Wood. For the time-being, Mitch Walker is back between the sticks for the Shots and the season now only has nine games left to play but what ambitions does Ryan have going forward?

'The first target was to make my debut, so now that's done it's really the next thing after that is to just keep pushing. For the rest of this season keep pushing Mitch and see if I can get a few more games. Then going longer-term and looking at next season, maybe to go out on loan to get more experience and play regularly throughout the season.'

Indeed, he might have gone put on loan this season but with the pandemic affecting things so much, in the end it didn't happen.

'It's been a big problem because I did have a club in the Conference South that I nearly went to and then a couple of weeks later, all the season and league stopped which is not ideal.'

It certainly wasn't ideal but remaining with the Shots for the whole of this season finally allowed Ryan to make that all-important league debut and has shown him just how well he can compete at this level, with the hope and expectation of further progress in the future, backed by club coaches and team mates alike.

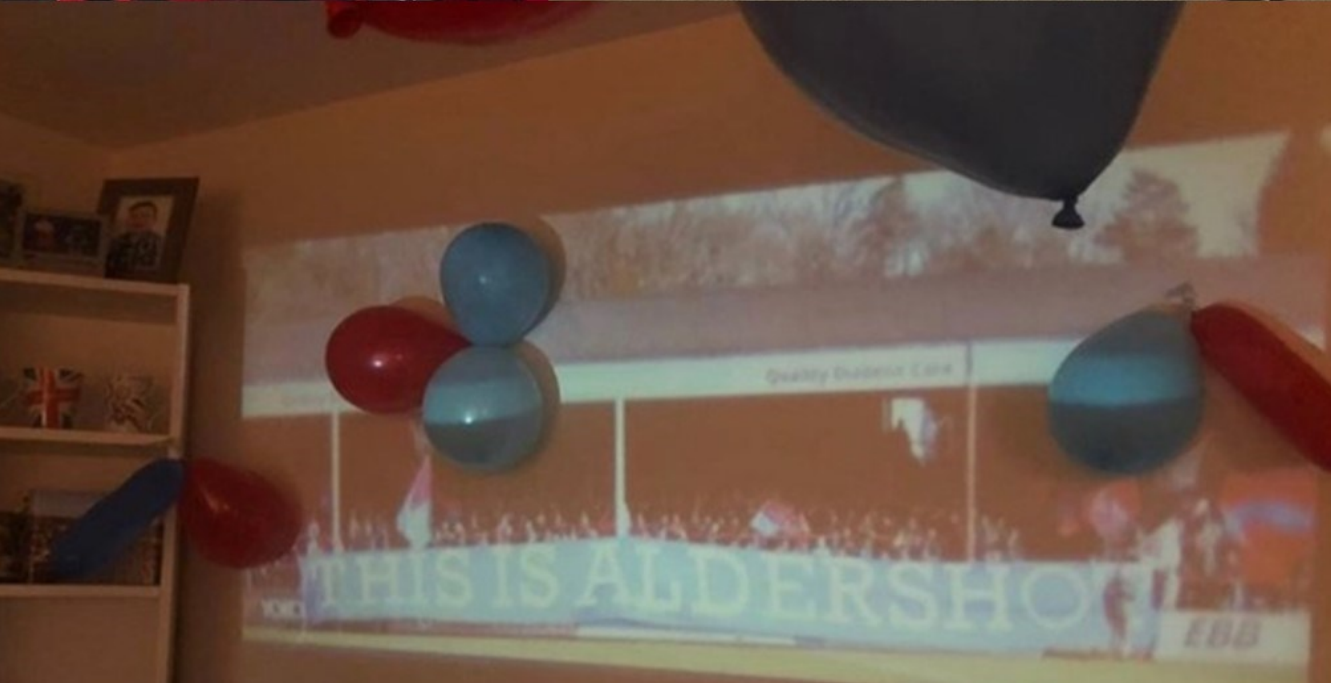

INTRODUCING KING'S LYNN TOWN

King's Lynn Town arrive for tonight's National League clash in 21st position in the table. King's Lynn secured two back-to-back promotions, in 2019 and 2020, bringing them to the National league for the first time since the Club was formed in 2010. King's Lynn have lost their last three league games, against Chesterfield, Stockport and Halifax. On Saturday King's Lynn went down 4-2 away at Halifax. Tonight's game will be the first time that the two sides have met this season with the return trip to The Walks taking place on the final day of the season. Ian Culverhouse's team have within the past ten days seen Adam Marriott leave the club to join Eastleigh and Kairo Mitchell join Chesterfield.

In goal against Halifax was Theo Richardson. Richardson has made eight league appearances for King's Lynn, keeping a clean sheet against Altrincham. There was not a goalkeeper named on the bench against Halifax.

In defence, Kyle Callan-McFadden is on loan from League of Ireland side, Sligo Rovers. Callan-McFadden has made 23 league appearances this season. Tyler Denton has made 23 league appearances this season and scored in the 2-2 draw against Weymouth in February. Rob Howard has signed on loan from Southend United. Howard has made six league appearances for King's Lynn. Earlier in the season Howard made two League Two appearances for Southend United.

In midfield, Michael Clunan has made 24 league appearances this season. Cameron King has made 20 league appearances, scoring in consecutive games against Barnet and Weymouth in February. Sonny Carey has made 31 league appearances this season, Carey scored in the 1-0 FA Cup First Round victory against Port Vale and was on the scoresheet in the 4-2 defeat by Halifax on Saturday, Carey's other two league goals have come against Chesterfield and Notts County. Ethan Coleman signed

from Brackley in March and has made five league appearances for King's Lynn. Elkan Baggott is on loan from Ipswich Town and has made four league appearances since signing at the end of March.

Up front, King's Lynn have experience with former Norwich and Gillingham striker Simeon Jackson. Jackson signed on loan from Chelmsford City and has made nine league appearances. Jackson has been capped 49 times by Canada, scoring six international goals. Alongside Jackson was Michael Gash. The former Cambridge and Barnet striker has made 19 league appearances for King's Lynn, scoring four goals. Gash scored two of the five goals in the 5-1 victory against Barnet. Gash's other goals have come against Dagenham & Redbridge and FC Halifax Town.

Following this evening's game, King's Lynn finish April with two home games. The Linnets welcome Dagenham & Redbridge on Saturday, before ending April's fixtures with the visit of Stockport on 27 April.

HISTORY

This evening's fixture is the first league encounter between the two sides. The only occasion that King's Lynn and The Shots have met previously, was in the FA Cup in 1959 when the Linnets were in their previous incarnation, King's Lynn FC. On 14 November 1959, King's Lynn took a 3-1 home victory against The Shots.

THE BOSS

IAN CULVERHOUSE

Fifty-six-year old Culverhouse started his playing career at Tottenham in 1982 but it was at Norwich City where the Essex-born defender made his name, making nearly 300 appearances for the Canaries over nine years, an achievement which earned him a place in the Norwich City Hall of Fame.

In 1994 he was sold to Swindon Town for £150,000 and turned out 97 times for the west Country side over the following four years. His playing career finished with two years at Brighton and Hove Albion, between 1998 and 2000.

Culverhouse then moved into football coaching, something which he had been working on while with Brighton. He was Reserve and Youth Team manager with Leyton Orient, rising to assistant manager, then held the same posts at Wycombe Wanderers. In 2008 he moved to Colchester United as assistant manager and after just short of a year with the Chairboys made a return to Norwich City to become their First Team assistant manager. It was a productive two years in the Premier League with Norwich finishing in 15th place in both the 12/13 and 13/14 campaigns.

Between February 2016 and 2017 Culverhouse held another assistant manager role, this time at non-league Dagenham and Redbridge and from there he moved into his first manager role in his own right, with

King's Lynn Town, at the time members of the Southern League Premier Division. He led the Club to a second-place finish, after which they lost in the play-off final. He subsequently left King's Lynn, and was named manager of Grantham Town at the end of May 2018. However, after

resigning as Grantham manager in October 2018 he returned to King's Lynn. Despite the Linnets being in the bottom half of the Southern League Central Premier table when Culverhouse rejoined the Club, form improved and the team climbed the table in the second half of the season. They clinched the runners-up spot on the final day of the season before winning the play-offs and Super play-offs to earn themselves a place in the National League North for the 2019/20 season. Despite being relegation favourites and suffering a 3-0 defeat to Guiseley on the opening day of the season, Culverhouse and his team defied the odds and found themselves in a promotion battle with York City. When the season was suspended in March 2020 due to the Covid outbreak, King's Lynn were in second position, two points behind York but with two games in hand. The League was finally settled

on a points-per-game calculation, crowning King's Lynn as Champions and securing them and Culverhouse a second successive promotion.

**MICHAEL
GASH**

Thirty-four-year-old Gash joined King's Lynn in 2017. The striker was born in Germany and spent his youth career with Peterborough United, Cambridge United and Cambridge City, with whom he commenced his professional career in 2003.

Besides both clubs in the university city, Gash has played for Ebbsfleet, York, Kidderminster Harriers and Barnet amongst others and has one England 'C' cap to his name, awarded in 2010. He was a part of the two King's Lynn promotion squads of 2019 and 2020.

CLUNAN**

Clunan is the Linnets' longest-serving player, now in his sixth season with the Club. The midfielder, who started out in the Norwich academy and who has also spent time with Boston United, Histon, Lowestoft and Dereham before signing for King's Lynn on 1 June 2015, has been in and out of the side this season but is currently wearing the captain's armband, having regained his place in the starting eleven.

**SONNY
CAREY**

Twenty-year-old Carey arrived at The Walks in the summer of 2019, signing from fellow East Anglian club, Wroxham. He had previously been with the Norwich Academy. The right-sided midfielder who can also play on the wing has been on target four times this season, including scoring the winning goal away at Port Vale in the FA Cup First Round in November 2020.

**CAMERON
KING**

Born in Bury St Edmonds, King first played for King's Lynn Town in 2018. A product of the Norwich Academy, Cameron spent 13 years with the Canaries but never made a first team appearance. He then played for Thetford Town and Shamrock Rovers before returning to the UK, spending two years with FC Halifax Town between 2018 and 2020. He then rejoined the Linnets in the summer of 2020 at the start of their first season in the National League.

Kyle Callan-McFadden

Kyle is a strong, ball playing defender. Kyle started his career with Irish Team Swilly Rovers before moving to Norwich City Academy at the age of 16. He was a member of the Norwich City Youth Team which beat Chelsea in the F.A. Youth Cup Final in 2013. Kyle made his debut for the Canaries in August 2014. In the autumn of 2015 he moved to Orlando City in the USA. He has made international appearances for The Republic of Ireland from Under-16 to Under-21 Level. Kyle joined Sligo Rovers, in the League of Ireland Premier Division, in late 2016, making over 100 appearances. He was named Captain of the team at the age of 22 and was always in the running for Player of the Year which he achieved in 2017.



Tai Fleming

A young local strong defender who was at Norwich City Academy from the age of 10 – 16, before joining Yeovil Town on a two year Scholarship. He joined King's Lynn Town in July 2020.

Ryan Jarvis

Ryan, a very cool calm experienced player, signed in the summer of 2017 after playing for Lowestoft Town since 2015. A Graduate of Norwich City Youth system, he became the Canaries' youngest ever first team player at the age of 16, making his debut in April 2003 and their youngest ever goal scorer later that year. Whilst at Norwich City he played for England at Under-16, Under-17 and Under-19 levels. He had loan spells with Colchester United, Leyton Orient, Kilmarnock and Notts County. In July 2008 Ryan joined Leyton Orient for two seasons before moving to Walsall for a season, finishing the season on loan at Torquay who signed him for 2012-13. He then moved to York City for two seasons, before joining Lowestoft Town in the summer of 2015. The wise senior player has had his influence within the team during the Club's recent promotions in the last two seasons into the National League.

Archie Mair

Archie is on loan from Norwich City for the current season. Signing for the Canaries in June 2019 from Aberdeen where he had played since 2009. Archie has represented Scotland at Under-19 level on seven occasions and is currently part of the Scotland Under-21 Squad.

Dayle Southwell

Dayle joined King's Lynn Town in January 2020 from Halifax Town FC, bringing a lot of experience in hitting the back of the net. A product of Grimsby Town's youth system, making his first appearance in the senior squad in the 2010/11 season and during the next three seasons whilst being in the Grimsby first team squad he had a loan spell with Harrogate Town. Dayle signed for Boston United in July 2014, scoring 54 goals in two seasons. Whilst at Boston United, Dayle was their Player of the Year on two occasions, was leading goalscorer in the National League North Division, and also made an appearance for England "C". He then moved to Wycombe Wanderers on a two-season contract. In January 2018 Dayle moved to Guisley and in the summer of 2018 he joined Halifax Town. Dayle featured in the last part of the 2019 / 20 promotion into the National League.



Theo Richardson

Goalkeeper who joined the club from Cleethorpes Town following an injury to first choice Archie Mair.

Theo started his career with Nottingham Forest, then Aston Villa before joining Leeds United on a two-year scholarship deal when he was 16. After a successful trial he joined Manchester United playing for both their U-18 and U-23 sides. Following his release in the summer of 2018 he joined Grantham Town where he was signed by current Lynn manager, Ian Culverhouse. After going on trial at Wolverhampton Wanderers and Hereford he joined Cleethorpes in December 2018.

Rob Howard

Right back who joined the club on loan until the end of the season from Southend United. Starting off in the Southend Academy he then joined Arsenal before joining Colchester United and playing for their U18s. After leaving Colchester he rejoined Southend, playing for their U23's and having loans at Harlow, Dartford and Braintree.

Elkan Baggott

Highly-rated centre back who joined on loan from Ipswich Town. The Indonesian U-19 international joined the Tractor Boys on moving to the UK in 2011, making his first team debut in October 2020 against Gillingham.

Alex Babos

Recent signing from Alfreton Town, on a deal until the end of the season. The Welsh U-21 international started his career with Derby County playing for their U-18 and U-23 sides and having loan spells at Real Union in Spain, and FC United of Manchester. On being released by Derby he joined Alfreton in October 2020.

Alfie Payne

Joined the Linnets on a loan deal from Lowestoft Town in March 2021, his second spell with the Club. A member of the Norwich City Academy he was a regular member of the U23 team during the 2018-19 season. Alfie was a member of the Linnets' National League North winning squad when spending the season on loan from the Canaries. On release from Norwich he joined Braintree Town before joining Lowestoft in November 2020.

Ethan Coleman

Another recent loan signing, this time from Brackley Town. Started his career at Reading at the age of nine he made his way up to their U-23 squad before being released in July 2020 and joining Brackley.

Joe Gascoigne

Local-born player who has been a regular with King's Lynn U-18 and U-21 teams. Started his career with Norwich City Academy before joining the Linnets. Usually plays in midfield but can play at right back.

Simeon Jackson

Experienced striker who joined Lynn on loan from Chelmsford City in March 2021.

On moving to England at the age of 15 he joined Rushden & Diamonds scoring 43 goals in 100 games before moving on to Gillingham in January 2008 for £150,000. Just over two years later, in July 2010 he joined Norwich City for a reported fee of £600,000, scoring the goal that took Norwich to promotion to the Premier League. He left Norwich in June 2013 after scoring 21 goals in 86 games.

A brief spell saw him play in the Bundesliga for Eintracht Braunschweig before moving back to England, signing for Millwall in February 2014. From there he moved onto Coventry City for the 2014-15 season before spells at Barnsley, Blackburn and Walsall (including a loan move to Grimsby Town). In September 2018 he moved to St Mirren and then Kilmarnock before joining Stevenage in January 2020 and then Chelmsford in February 2021 making two

appearances and scoring once before their season was curtailed.

Michael Gyasi

Joined the Linnets in December from St Ives Town where he made 10 appearances scoring, four goals in the 2020/21 season. A winger/striker he spent his early career with the Northampton Town Academy before Chelsea paid a fee for him when he was just 11 years of age. Two years later he joined the Leicester City Academy before being released in 2016 and played for a number of non-league clubs including Nuneaton, Bedford, Barton Rovers, Coggeshall Town, Cambridge City and Daventry.

Alex represented England up to Under-19 level.

Attacking left back, the England U-17 international joined in January 2021 after leaving Chesterfield. Tyler started his career at Leeds United, signing professional terms in 2014. During his time at Elland Road he made three first team appearances and having loan spells at Port Vale and Peterborough United. In 2019 he joined Stevenage for an undisclosed fee making 19 appearances before joining Chesterfield in October 2020, making five appearance before joining the Linnets.

Florian Guimdo Tsgium

Pacey forward who is a regular member of the U-21 squad who he joined after being released from Peterborough United.

GOLDEN GOALS

Ryan Jarvis v Welling United

Saturday 14 February 2015

Aldershot Town 2 – 1 Welling United

In a match that was defined by drama in added time at the end of each half, it was a loanee, Ryan Jarvis, who saved the day for Aldershot Town and gave caretaker player/manager Chris Barker his first win in charge of the Shots.

Indeed, Chris had only taken on the role three weeks earlier after Andy Scott had reached the end of the road with Aldershot Town, a run of nine losses in all competitions in ten matches finally seeing his departure. The Board then turned to Barker to ask him to do just one job – keep the club in the Vanarama Conference, a tough challenge with the Shots in the precarious position of 18th with a third of the season left to play – and his reign had unfortunately started with a loss away to Altrincham. Now though the Shots were at home and although a quite frankly low crowd was watching the game, those who were there finally had something to cheer about, even if they had to wait for practically the entire game before the celebrations could commence.



Welling, under the management of Loui Fazakerley were also struggling at the wrong end of the table and were as desperate for points as the Shots were. Indeed, it was unusual in that a match was being played with two player/managers on the pitch, Fazakerley holding that role for the Wings and Barker in his usual place for the Shots, on the left of defence and for a long time, it was the defences who were working to keep the game goalless.

The home side were mainly in the ascendancy but it wasn't until the 41st minute that there was finally a breakthrough, a Jordan Roberts corner found Brett Williams who headed the ball down for Jim Stevenson to hit the ball home. The delight that this goal caused among the home supporters lasted precisely six minutes as, right in front of the East Bank, Dominic Vose brought the visitors level with a fine strike in time added on for the first half. Chastened, the Shots went in at half-time to discuss how they could beat back a determined Welling team.

The second half saw Aldershot Town make their first substitution, Tristan Plummer on for the injured Joe Oastler which necessitated a reshuffle at the back. Despite this, the second 45 minute period had long spells of limited goal mouth activity at both ends of the pitch. Stevenson had an excellent strike turned away by former Shots loanee, Jonathan Henley, now keeping goal for the Wings but it was clear that something would need to change in order to find that elusive winning goal for Aldershot Town.



Mixing things up a little, Barker and assistant Matt Gray took off leading goalscorer Brett Williams in the 69th minute and replaced him with Ryan Jarvis.

Jarvis had arrived at the Club a month earlier, from York City. The 28-year-old forward had had a long career, starting with Norwich City for whom he had scored a goal against Liverpool in the Premier League ten years earlier. He had also made appearances for Colchester, Walsall and Torquay along with over 100 appearances for Leyton Orient between 2007 and 2011, scoring 16 goals. Thus far he had made two starts and one substitute appearance for his new club with no goals but that was about to change although it was to take a further 20-plus minutes to do so, shredding the nerves of the 1,400-odd Shots supporters still further.

With only moments remaining on the clock Tristan Plummer, who had recently returned to the club at the behest of Chris Barker, made his way into the box and was fouled; referee Nigel Lugg had no hesitation in awarding a spot-kick and it looked as though the game was set to end in huge drama and potential celebration. The only problem was that regular penalty taker, Brett Williams, was not on the pitch and there seemed to be a little hesitancy over who might take his place! Minor confusion reigned on the pitch in front of the East Bank before it was realised that a decision needed to be made – Jarvis took the ball, stepped up

to the spot and rifled the ball home to the delight of the noisy and passionate supporters massed immediately behind the goal! Afterwards he said that it didn't seem that that many people wanted to take it but he was glad he grabbed the ball – it was his first goal in 13 months!

The players also celebrated in the manner expected of a late and dramatic goal and just a minute later it was all over as Lugg blew his whistle to end the game. It was a huge three points which went a long way to retaining Aldershot Town's place in the Conference for the following season, although it was a squad that didn't contain Jarvis as he left the Recreation Ground following the final game of the season, having made 12 appearances, six as a substitute, and scoring one goal.

Ryan also left parent club York and joined Lowestoft Town in the summer of 2015 and scored nine goals in 56 appearances before moving to King's Lynn Town in 2017, a club he remains with till this day. But for Shots supporters he will always be remembered for that winning penalty goal – moments left on the clock, a goal vitally needed, usual penalty taker not on the pitch, the scorer having not hit the back of the net in over a year – when that goal went in, it was most definitely golden...
